A significant thread in Milwaukee's fabric, Milwaukee Public Schools is impacted by the weave of the city as a whole. A historical context to Milwaukee's segregated past is essential to understanding current challenges faced within our city and our school district. Jackson will set the scene and lead a discussion about positive solutions to uplift students and families.

Reggie Jackson is a speaker, author, and journalist. He works with communities, institutions, and individuals to develop greater historical and cultural literacy, compassion, and capacity for action. A former teacher and university adjunct professor, Jackson is currently the Head Griot at America's Black Holocaust Museum.
